## Beaver Valley River Response Task Force



Two local police departments are creating a new law enforcement program to benefit Beaver County businesses and residents. The Beaver Borough and Center Township Police Departments have formed the Beaver Valley River Response Task Force to fill a critical gap in security in Beaver County. Despite the fact that billions of dollars worth of commerce travels down the Ohio River each year and that there are areas that are potential terrorist targets, there are no local law enforcement patrols along the waterways. If there is a crisis, law enforcement must be called in from outside of the county.

The goal of the Beaver Valley River Response Task Force is to discourage crime on the waterways and to make the waterways safer for the local residents and businesses.

The task force will work in cooperation with the Pennsylvania State Police and Medic Rescue ambulance service. The force also includes Vanport Township, which is patrolled by the Beaver police, and Potter Township, which is patrolled by the Center Township police. The task force members will be trained through coordinated training programs with the city of Pittsburgh's River Rescue program, the U.S. Coast Guard, and the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission, as well as other local, state and federal agencies.

An officer on the new task force has a U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Marine license and has training and extensive knowledge of the waterways within the Port of Pittsburgh. This officer will act as a liaison between the various agencies and assist in further development of the task force.

The patrol boat will be paid for largely with a \$140,000 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the state Department of Economic and Community Development. There is also a fundraising committee in place to help with the remainder of the financial upkeep.

The task force will have daytime and nighttime patrols to provide law enforcement coverage on the water for the

local chemical plants and oil and chemical storage tanks and to assist with general waterway improvements and awareness. They will also patrol during large events such as the Beaver River Regatta and annual Fourth of July celebrations. Center Township and Beaver Borough have agreed to be the front-running agencies for this program, which will eventually branch out to encompass all river communities in Beaver County.

## Beaver's New Sculpture in Metal



An attractive, hand-forged, fabricated steel sculpture adorns Beaver's newest office building in the heart of the Third Street business district, commissioned to celebrate the completion of this landmark structure, and as a permanent signature decoration further enhancing Beaver's ambience as a Pittsburgh magazine "Top 10 Neighborhood."

Measuring six feet, one inch wide by 10 feet high, and weighing 1,000 lbs., the sculpture's design is a collaboration of the building's architect Rob Pfaffmann and Red Star Ironworks metal artist Peter Michael Lambert. It symbolizes the bedrock values, beliefs and culture that have built the

Cottrill Arbutina public accounting firm since its founding in 1984.

A close look reveals the swirling elements of a dollar bill design, emphasizing the importance of prudent financial management in today's society. It is embedded with icons of the firm and its beliefs — an intertwined "C" and "A," which is the firm's longstanding logo; a key-hole, representing the firm's aspiration to be a key to its clients' financial success; and "E4-12," a reference to the power of working together, from the biblical verse Ecclesiastes 4:12: "Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken."

The cords also represent the different disciplines, experiences and perspectives the firm brings to its new home to positively impact clients.

The sculpture will be backlit in the evening, adding to its visibility and charm for passersby.

Said sculptor Lambert: "For this project I wanted the ironwork to be fun. It was important that the ironwork pushed off the building and out into the street, inspired by the boldness of Spanish Ironwork of the 1920s and '30s."

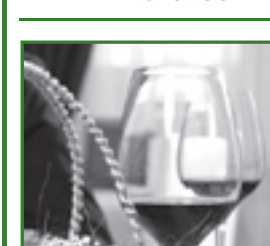
